Dan Gottlieb's studio practice is photo-generated work that investigates the boundaries of environmental and human dislocation. Having spent forty years creating cultural spaces and environments for art in the public realm, I now focus my creative life on personal perspectives that convey a subjective, often "blurry" aesthetic to depict nature and the human condition, sometimes void of edges or boundaries. Visual ambiguity and mystery are core to my picture-making, as are a deep interest in environmental sciences and material process of picture making.

Season Five and **Forest Portraits** are ongoing multi-year series that explore forest environments and climate-induced wildfire - their impacts on fragile ecosystems and human settlement. The project began while recuperating from a potentially fatal incident, with daily forest walks. In recovery, I learned again (this time digitally) how to use a camera as an extension of my vision, my body, and my breath to capture nature's constant motion – a familiar way of seeing nature and cityscapes alike.

A student of both art and biology plus my early museum design work for a natural history museum gave me a solid foundation for my current direction. In 2021 I trekked the enormous devastation of the Sequoia and KNP complex fires and returned for a 2022 residency with UC Berkley climate scientists at a field station, where I explored Northern Sierra Nevada wildfire sites to better understand global changes we collectively experience.

Walkers of the World is a related series of portraits of people in motion. As the forest is fluid, yet earth-bound, we walk the world as a blur through time and space. The universal nature of walking stiches histories and culture.

Picture making process is of my own design, using non-traditional materials and with laborious effort. Long camera exposures are processed, digitally reversed, and printed on clear acrylic panels. I then apply foundational layers of paint behind the image to provide luminosity before hand-polishing the surface with fine compounds.

Education: An autodidact who overcame childhood hearing and learning disabilities, my (unlikely) university education was in art and biology (SUNY Buffalo), furniture design and photography (San Diego State University), and arts administration (Winthrop University). But my real education is self-taught through decades of collaboration in environmental design and architecture and on by ongoing photographic experimentation.
